# Being Still with God

## What

A guided quiet time that encourages you to slow down, reflect, and listen to God. This activity helps practice stillness, focus, and personal worship in a noisy world.

## Time Required

- 10-20 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Psalm 46:10 (Be still, and know that I am God)
- Psalm 62:5 (Find rest in God alone)
- Isaiah 30:15 (Rest and trust in God)

## Materials Needed:

- Quiet space
- Pillows or mats for sitting
- Optional: soft worship music or dim lighting

## Steps

- **Scripture Reading:** Begin with Psalm 46:10 and think about what it means to "be still" before God.

- **Prepare the Space:** Arrange a quiet area with mats or pillows. Dim lights or play soft music if desired.
- **Invite Reflection:** Close your eyes and focus on your breathing, imagining God's presence around them.
- **Silent Time:** Spend 5-10 minutes in silence, listening for God or reflecting on a chosen verse.
- **Optional Journaling:** Write or draw what you sense or learn during the quiet time.
- **Closing Prayer:** End by thanking God for His presence and asking for help to notice Him throughout daily life.



# Prayer Walk

## What

A Prayer Walk (or Prayer Trail) is an interactive way to connect with God while walking through a designated path, trail, or outdoor area. Along the way, pause at stations to pray, reflect, or respond creatively to Scripture, deepening your personal connection with God in a natural, meditative environment.

## Time Required

- 20-40 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Psalm 23:2-3 (Beside quiet waters)
- Matthew 6:6 (Pray in private)
- Isaiah 40:31 (Renew their strength)

## Materials Needed:

- Paper or small cards with Scriptures or prayer prompts
- Clipboards or notebooks and pens
- Optional: small symbols, stones, or objects to mark prayer stations
- Optional: ropes, cones, or markers to outline the trail

## Steps

- Choose a Trail or Path
- Prepare Stations: At each station, place a Scripture verse, reflection question, or prayer prompt on a card or small sign. You can also include symbolic objects like a small rock, leaf, or candle to inspire meditation.
- Start Walking: At each station, take a few minutes to read the verse, reflect, and pray.
- Continue Through the Stations: Move from one station to the next, repeating the reflection, prayer, or creative activity at each stop.
- Optional Creative Response: Have materials at some stations to write a word, draw a symbol, or place a stone to visually represent your prayer or reflection.
- Closing Prayer: Conclude with a prayer thanking God for His presence in creation, for guidance along the path, and for the time of reflection.



# Prayer Stones

## What

A tactile and visual way to represent prayers. Write a word, name, or concern on a stone, creating a tangible reminder of God's faithfulness and your prayer life. This activity encourages reflection and makes prayer concrete.

## Time Required

- 10-20 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Joshua 4:1-7 (stones as reminders of God's work)
- 1 Peter 5:7 (cast your anxieties on Him)
- Psalm 62:8 (trust in God at all times)

## Materials Needed:

- Smooth stones (one per participant)
- Permanent markers or paint pens
- Optional: small bowls or trays to display stones

## Steps

- Scripture Reflection: Read Joshua 4:1-7 and discuss how God's people used stones as reminders of His faithfulness.
- Write or Draw on a smooth stone, write a word, name, or draw a small symbol that represents your prayer.
- Optional Decoration: Color or embellish the stone with small symbols or designs.
- Place in Display: Collect the stones in a bowl or tray to remember your prayers
- Closing Prayer: Pray over the stones, thanking God for His faithfulness and asking Him to hear and respond to the prayers represented.



# Color Prayer

## What

A visual prayer using colors to represent feelings, intentions, or aspects of a Scripture. Instead of words, the page becomes a map of emotion and worship, showing what God is doing in your heart.

## Time Required

- 10 to 20 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Passages about peace, hope, love, or God's guidance
- Verses with strong emotion or imagery

## Materials Needed:

- Paper or journal
- Colored pencils, markers, or crayons

## Steps

- Choose a verse or passage that stands out to you.
- Assign a color to each feeling or idea
  - Blue for peace

- Red for sacrifice
- Gold for God or glory
- Begin filling the page with shapes, swirls, or patterns using your chosen colors.
- Let each section of color represent a prayer, thought, or reflection.
- Move slowly, focusing on how the verse makes you feel.
- Layer colors if one feeling overlaps another.
- At the end, pause and reflect on the page as a visual prayer, connecting back to the Scripture.



# Fingerprint Prayer

## What

A creative worship activity where you use your own fingerprints as a physical and visual expression of prayer. Each print represents a prayer, a praise, or a reflection on a Scripture verse.

## Time Required

- 15-30 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Psalm 139:13-14 (God knits us together)
- Isaiah 64:8 (We are the clay)
- 1 Peter 4:10 (Use gifts to serve others)

## Materials Needed:

- Ink pads or washable stamp pads (variety of colors optional)
- Paper, sketchbook, or cardstock
- Pens or fine-tip markers
- Bible or Scripture printouts
- Optional: stickers, watercolor, or colored pencils for embellishment

## Steps

- **Set up Your Space** Arrange the paper or sketchbooks, ink pads, and markers on a table.
- **Make Fingerprints** Dip a fingertip lightly into the ink pad and press onto the paper or sketchbook. Write the prayer, praise, or reflection next to or inside the fingerprint. Repeat for each new prayer, thought, or Scripture connection.
- **Add Creative Elements** Turn fingerprints into symbols or small designs, like flowers, stars, or crosses, using markers or colored pencils. Combine fingerprints into patterns or groupings to create visual "prayer art."
- **Reflect on Your Work** Take a few minutes to look over all the fingerprints. Reflect on how many prayers or thoughts have been offered. Ask questions like: *What do I see about God in this activity? How does this verse connect with my life today?*



# Guided Writing Prompts

## What

A creative worship activity that uses guided writing prompts to help you think deeply, reflect on Scripture, and express your thoughts, prayers, and insights in written form.

## Time Required

- 15-30 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Psalm 119:105
- Habakkuk 2:2
- Psalm 45:1



## Materials Needed:

- Paper, journal, or notebook
- Pens, pencils, or colored markers
- Optional: quiet music, candle, highlighters

## Steps

- Choose a Scripture Focus: Start by reading a passage of Scripture. Choose a verse, phrase, or theme that stands out.
- Set the Tone: Before writing, take 1-2 minutes of quiet stillness. Ask God to guide

your thoughts and reveal what He wants you to notice in the Scripture.

- Use guided writing prompts that help channel reflection, insight, and prayer. Prompts can be general or themed depending on the message or Scripture. Examples include:
  - *What part of this verse stands out most to you and why?*
  - *How does this Scripture make you feel? Write honestly without judgment.*
  - *What is God inviting you to do, change, or notice in your life right now?*
  - *Write a short prayer back to God based on this passage.*
  - *If this Scripture were a conversation between you and God, what would God be saying? What would you reply?*
- Let writing flow without worrying about grammar, spelling, or structure. This is *worship through expression*, not a writing class.
- Add Creative Elements (Optional): After writing, use color, illustrations, or symbols to highlight key ideas or emotions in the text.

# Dirt Reflection

## What

A creative devotional activity where you use dirt or soil as a medium to reflect on growth, life, and God's shaping work.

## Time Required

- 15-30 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Isaiah 64:8 (God is the potter)
- Genesis 2:7 (God forms man from the dust)
- John 15:5 (Abide in me to bear fruit)



## Materials Needed:

- Small containers of dirt or soil
- Paper, sketchbook, or tray for shaping
- Pens or markers
- Optional: small stones, leaves, or natural embellishments

## Steps

- Prepare the Space. Set up a table or outdoor area with dirt and materials.

- Choose a Scripture. Read a verse that connects creation, growth, or God's shaping work.
- Reflect on Life. Think about your growth, challenges, and spiritual journey.
- Consider questions like:
  - *Where have you grown the most?*
  - *What "storms" have shaped you?*
- Use Dirt as a Medium. Form shapes, letters, or simple symbols in the dirt to represent life, prayer, or reflection. Examples:
  - a seed for new growth
  - a path for life's journey
  - a cross for faith.
- Write or Draw Alongside. Use paper or tray edges to write reflections, prayers, or verses inspired by the dirt shapes.
- Close with a prayer asking God to continue shaping, growing, and guiding your life like clay in His hands.
- OPTIONAL Nature Additions: Include leaves, rocks, or water to reflect God's creation and life's changing seasons.

# Tree Cookie Testimony

## What

A hands-on way to reflect on your life and spiritual journey using a tree cookie (a cross-section slice of a tree trunk). Each ring represents a year of life, showing periods of growth, challenges, and transformation.

## Time Required

- 20 to 30 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Passages about growth, seasons, or God's work in life
- Verses about perseverance, fruitfulness, or reflection

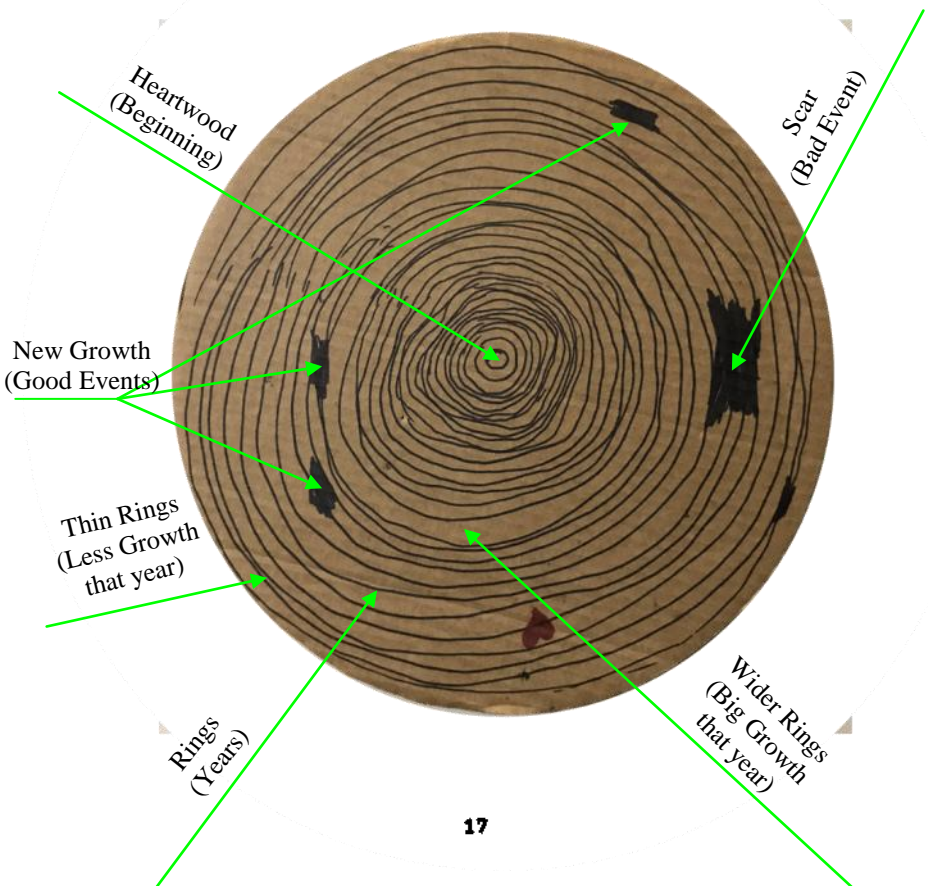
## Materials Needed:

- Round, Cardboard Cake circles
- Fine-tip markers or pens
- Optional colored pencils or paint

## Steps

- Turn your Cake Circle into a tree cookie slice.
  - Each ring represents a year of your life.

- Wider rings show times of strong growth (spiritual milestones, positive decisions).
- Narrower rings show slower growth or quieter seasons.
- Mark any "new growth" on the rings that reflect meaningful spiritual decisions or lessons learned.
- Note any "storm damage" for hard seasons, challenges, or mistakes.
- Reflect on how even small growth adds up over time, just as in a real tree..



# Prayer Jar Reflections

## What

A simple but powerful creative worship activity where you write prayers, confessions, or praises on slips of paper and place them in a jar. Over time, the jar becomes a tangible collection of your spiritual life.

## Time Required

- 10-20 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Philippians 4:6 (Pray about everything)
- 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 (Pray continually)
- Matthew 18:20 (God is present in gathered prayer)

## Materials Needed:

- A large jar or container
- Small slips of paper or sticky notes
- Pens or pencils
- Optional: colored slips for different types of prayers

## Steps

- Write Prayers on slips of paper. Write honestly and thoughtfully, including requests, praise, or Scripture reflections.
- Drop Them In a Jar. Fold or roll each slip and place it in the jar.
- Reflect on the Collection
- Periodically, take a few slips out to pray over.
- Optional Variations
  - Color-Coded Prayers: Blue for praise, red for requests, green for reflections.
  - Memory Jar: Keep the jar as a reminder of answered prayers and growth.
  - Weekly Prompts: Get a new theme each week for the prayers.



# Rewrite the Word

## What

A Scripture-centered worship activity where you slowly rewrite a passage of the Bible by hand. There is no art or design involved. The focus is on slowing down, engaging deeply with the text, and allowing God's Word to sink in through intentional repetition.

## Time Required

- 10-20 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Deuteronomy 6:6-9 (Write God's Word on your heart)
- Psalm 119:11 (Hiding God's Word in your heart)
- Joshua 1:8 (Meditate on the Word day and night)
- 2 Timothy 3:16 (Scripture is God-breathed)

## Materials Needed:

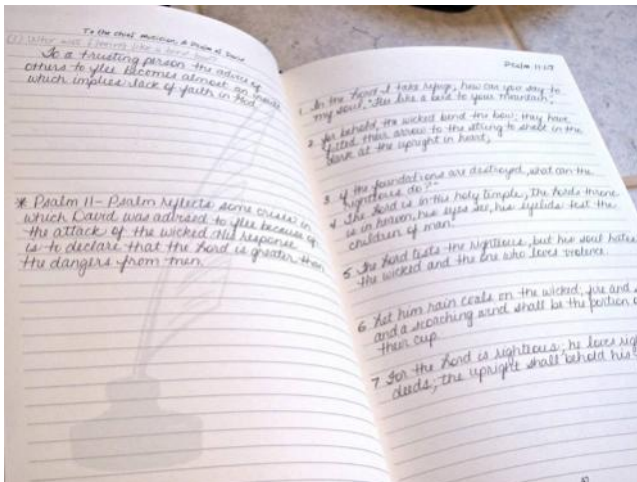
- Bibles or printed Scripture passages
- Journals or notebooks
- Pens or pencils

## Steps

- Choose a short passage of Scripture and read it slowly before beginning.
- Rewrite the passage word for word in your journal, taking time with each sentence.
- After rewriting, pause and note any words or phrases that stood out.

## Optional Variations

- Rewrite and Reflect: Rewrite the passage, then write a short prayer or response.
- Emphasis Pass: Rewrite the passage again, underlining or circling key words.
- Personal Paraphrase: After copying the text, rewrite it in your own words.

# Faith Conversation

## What

Guided question-and-answer Bible study activity that encourages you to think through and discuss core beliefs of the Christian faith.

## Time Required

- 20-40 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- 1 Peter 3:15 (Always be ready to explain your hope)
- Colossians 2:6-7 (Continue to walk in Christ, rooted and built up)
- Psalm 119:105 (God's Word is a lamp to our feet and light to our path)

## Materials Needed:

- Bibles or printed passages
- Question prompts
- Journals or paper
- Pens or pencils

# Steps

- Select a short Bible passage and a related set of questions (for example, questions about Jesus life, salvation, prayer, or trust in God).
- Read the Scripture slowly. Give participants a few minutes to think about and write answers to the first question.

# Scripture Quilt

## What

Everyone responds to the same message or Scripture using words, drawings, symbols, or a word cloud on a single square piece of paper. When all the squares are finished, they are displayed together on a wall to create one large "quilt" that shows how God spoke differently to each person through the same truth.

## Time Required

- 10 to 15 minutes to create

## Scripture Fit

- Short passages
- Key verses from a message
- Big idea or theme verses
- Verses focused on identity, faith, trust, or God's character

## Materials Needed:

- Square pieces of paper (all the same size)
- Markers, pens, or colored pencils
- Tape or removable wall adhesive
- Wall or board space for display

## How

- Everyone receives one square piece of paper.
- Read the Scripture or briefly restate the main message.
- On the paper, respond to what the message means personally. This can be:
  - A drawing or symbol
  - Key words or phrases
  - A word cloud
  - A short prayer or thought
  - There is no right or wrong way to respond. The goal is honesty, not artistic skill.
- When finished, bring the squares to the wall and place them next to each other.
- Step back and look at the full "quilt" as a group, noticing how many different responses came from the same truth.



# Bible Art Journal

## What

A creative response inside a Bible or journal where art, notes, and Scripture live together. This turns Bible reading into an interactive conversation instead of just reading words on a page.

## Time Required

- 10 to 30 minutes

## Scripture Fit

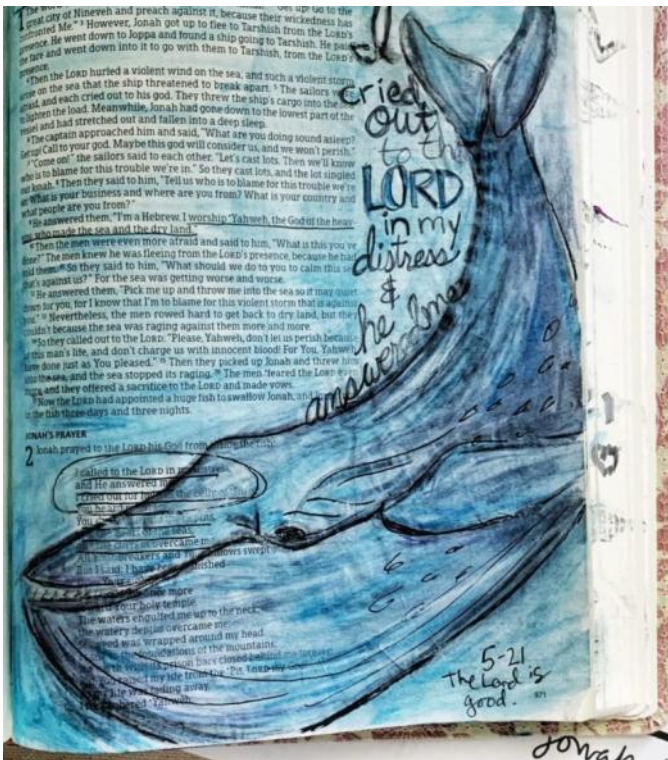
- Any passage
- Verses that stand out personally
- Psalms and promises
- Application focused Scripture

## Materials Needed:

- Bible or journal
- Pens, colored pencils, or markers
- Optional washi tape or stickers

# How

- Read the selected Scripture slowly.
- Choose a verse or phrase that stands out.
- Write, draw, underline, or decorate around the text to show what it means.
- Add symbols, colors, or short notes that capture thoughts or prayers.
- Let the page reflect how God is speaking personally, not what looks impressive.
- Revisit the page later and notice what still stands out.



# Cut and Paste Scripture

## What

A visual collage made from magazine words and images that express the meaning of a verse or message. This turns Scripture into something you can literally piece together.

## Time Required

- 15 to 25 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Short verses
- Themed passages
- Promises and encouragement
- Identity and faith focused Scripture

## Materials Needed:

- Magazines or printed images
- Scissors
- Glue sticks
- Paper or cardstock

## How

- Read the Scripture or share the theme.
- Flip through magazines looking for words, phrases, or images that connect.
- Cut out anything that represents the message or personal response.
- Arrange the pieces on the page before gluing.
- Glue everything down once the layout feels right.
- Take a moment to reflect on why each piece was chosen.



# Doodle the Word

## What

A visual response to Scripture using simple doodles, icons, and symbols instead of full drawings or paragraphs. This is about capturing meaning, emotion, and key ideas from the verse through quick, simple visuals that anyone can do.

## Time Required

- 10 to 15 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Short verses
- Memory verses
- Key lines from a message
- Passages with strong imagery or action words



## Materials Needed:

- Paper, journal, or Bible margin space
- Pens, markers, or colored pencils

## How

- Read the verse slowly, one time through.
- Read it a second time and circle or underline words that stand out.
- For each highlighted word, think of a simple symbol or image that represents it.
  - Faith might become a shield or a seed.
  - Light might become a candle or sun.
  - Trust might become open hands.
- Begin doodling those symbols around the verse or across the page.
- Keep drawings simple. Stick figures, shapes, arrows, and icons work great.
- Repeat symbols or words to fill the space and reinforce meaning.
- Add color if it helps express emotion or emphasis.
- When finished, take a moment to look over the page and reflect on how the visuals connect back to the Scripture.

# Comic the Verse

## What

The Scripture is retold as a short comic strip, using simple drawings, panels, and captions to visually show what the verse or passage is saying. This helps break Scripture into moments and makes meaning easier to see and remember.

## Time Required

- 15 to 20 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Bible stories
- Parables
- Narrative passages
- Verses that describe action or change

## Materials Needed:

- Paper or journal
- Pens, markers, or colored pencils
- Optional ruler for panel lines

## How

- Read the Scripture or passage all the way through.
- Break the verse or story into 3 to 6 key moments or scenes.
- Lightly draw boxes or panels on the page, one for each moment.
- In each panel, draw a simple picture that shows what is happening. Stick figures are completely fine.
- Add short captions, speech bubbles, or keywords from the verse to clarify meaning.
- Focus on the main idea rather than small details.
- Use facial expressions, movement lines, or symbols to show emotion or action.
- When finished, read the verse again while looking at the comic to see how the story comes together visually.



# Framed Scripture

## What

The Scripture is written in the center of the page and surrounded by illustrated borders, patterns, or images that reflect the theme, emotion, or message of the verse.

## Time Required

- 10 to 15 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Any verse
- Memory verses
- Psalms
- Promises or encouragement passages

## Materials Needed:

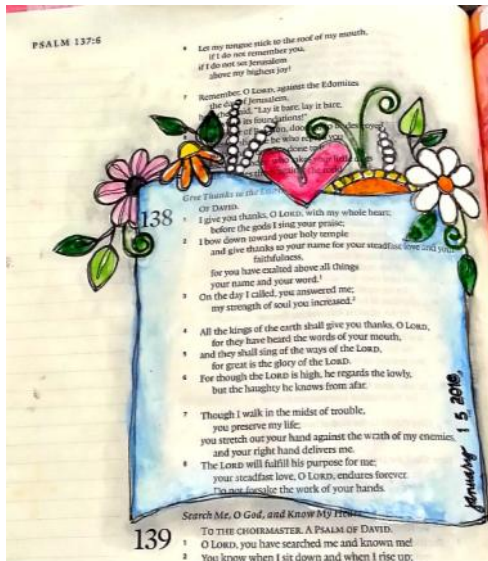
- Paper, journal, or Bible margin space
- Pens, markers, or colored pencils

## How

- Write the Scripture neatly in the center of the page.
- Read the verse again and identify its main theme or feeling: Peace, trust, joy, strength,

hope, protection, etc.

- Begin drawing a border around the verse using images or patterns that match that theme.
  - Waves for peace
  - Flames or light for God's presence
  - Vines or branches for growth
- Let the border grow naturally. It does not need to be symmetrical or perfect.
- Add repeating patterns, small symbols, or words that echo the verse.
- Use color intentionally to reinforce the mood of the Scripture.
- Step back and read the verse one final time, allowing the artwork to guide reflection.



# Verse Mapping

## What

A creative way to slow down and explore a single verse by visually breaking it apart.

Words, phrases, symbols, and personal thoughts surround the Scripture, helping reveal meaning and personal connection.

## Time Required

- 15 to 25 minutes

## Scripture Fit

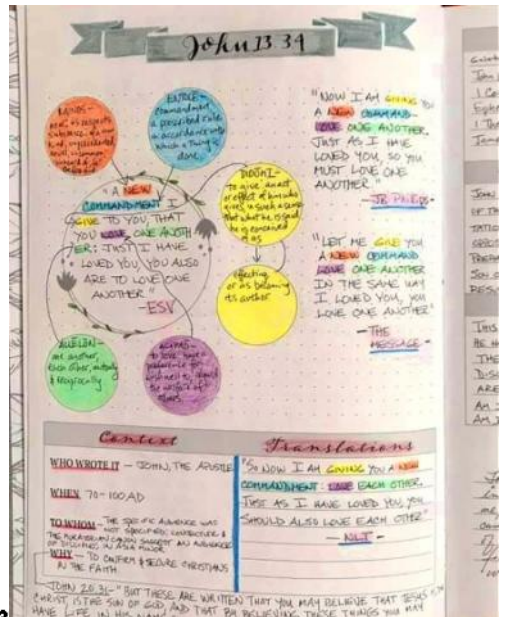
- Key verses
- Meaning dense passages
- Verses with strong action words or promises

## Materials Needed:

- Paper or journal
- Pens, markers, or colored pencils

# How

- Write the chosen verse in the center of the page.
- Read the verse slowly and circle or underline words that stand out.
- Draw arrows pointing outward from those key words.
- Next to each arrow, write thoughts, questions, or definitions that come to mind.
- Add small drawings or symbols that represent word meanings or emotions.
- Use color to group similar ideas or themes together.
- Leave space for prayer, writing a short response or application connected to the verse.
- Read the verse again and reflect on how the details changed understanding.



# Mixed Media Devo

## What

A layered, hands on worship response that combines Scripture with textures, patterns, and visual elements. This approach allows the message to be experienced through touch and creativity, not just words.

## Time Required

- 20 to 30 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Themed passages
- Worship focused Scripture
- Verses tied to emotion or identity

## Materials Needed:

- Paper, cardstock, or journal
- Washi tape, stickers, scrapbook paper, fabric scraps
- Glue or tape
- Pens or markers

## How

- Read the Scripture or reflect on the message quietly.
- Choose materials that match the mood or theme of the verse.
- Tear or cut pieces to create background layers on the page.
- Secure the layers with glue or tape.
- Write the verse or a key phrase over or between the layers.
- Add drawings, symbols, or words that connect personally to the message.
- Let the page feel textured and imperfect.
- Finish by sitting with the page and turning the visuals into a short prayer.



# Letter the Word

## What

A worship response that focuses on how words look as much as what they say. Scripture, phrases, or single words are written using creative lettering styles so that the shape, size, and flow of the letters reflect the meaning of the verse.

## Time Required

- 10 to 20 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Short verses
- Key phrases
- Names or attributes of God

## Materials Needed:

- Paper or journal
- Markers, pens, or brush pens
- Optional ruler or pencil for guidelines

## How

- Choose a verse, phrase, or single word from the message.
- Write it once lightly in pencil to plan spacing and layout.
- Rewrite the words using thicker lines, different styles, or varied letter sizes.
- Let the lettering reflect meaning.
  - Tall letters for strength
  - Flowing letters for peace
  - Bold block letters for confidence
- Add emphasis to important words by making them larger or darker.
- Decorate around the lettering with simple lines, shapes, or symbols.
- Trace over final letters with marker or pen if desired.
- Read the verse slowly and reflect on how the lettering changes the way it feels.

# Scripture Symbol Art

## What

A single symbol is used to visually represent the main idea of a verse. The Scripture and the symbol work together to communicate truth in a simple but powerful way.

## Time Required

- 10 to 15 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Metaphor rich verses
- Passages with clear imagery
- Teaching that uses symbols

## Materials Needed:

- Paper or journal
- Pens, markers, or colored pencils

## How

- Read the Scripture and identify its main image or metaphor. Seed, vine, light, shield, path, anchor
- Choose one symbol that best represents the verse's meaning.

- Draw the symbol large in the center of the page.
- Write the verse inside, around, or flowing through the symbol.
- Add small details that reinforce meaning without overcrowding the page.
- Use color intentionally to reflect emotion or emphasis.
- Sit quietly and reflect on how the symbol helps the verse stay memorable.



# Themed Scripture Posters

## What

A large visual response built around a single theme rather than one verse. Scriptures, words, drawings, and symbols all come together to show what the Bible says about that topic.

## Time Required

- 20 to 30 minutes

## Scripture Fit

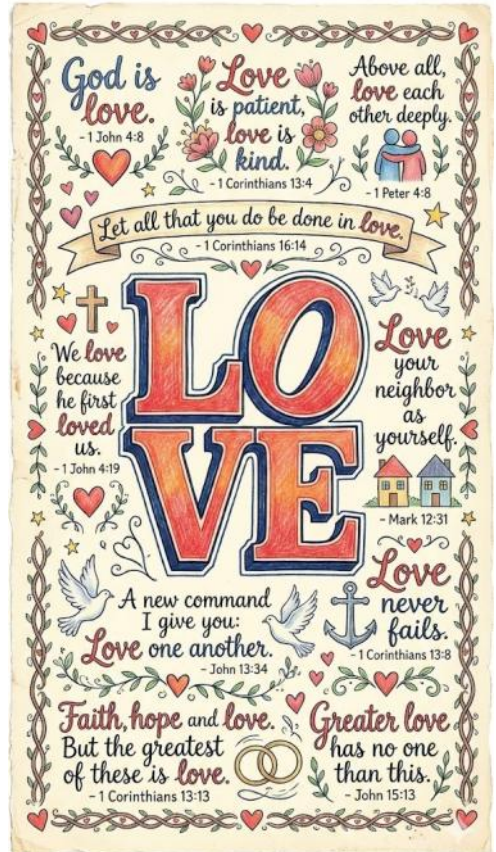

- God's attributes
- Psalms
- Bible promises

## Materials Needed:

- Poster board or large paper
- Markers, pens, or colored pencils
- Optional magazines or printed verses

## How

- Choose a theme connected to the message.

- Write the theme word or phrase large on the poster.
- Add Scriptures that relate to the theme around the page.

# Gratitude Pages

## What

## Scripture Fit

- Thanksgiving passages
- Psalms
- Verses about God's faithfulness

## Materials Needed:

- Paper or journal
- Pens, markers, or colored pencils

## How

- Read the Scripture quietly and reflect on what it says about gratitude.
- Write the verse or a key phrase at the top or center of the page.
- Begin listing things you are thankful for.
  - Big things
  - Small everyday things
  - People, moments, or blessings
- Add simple icons, symbols, or colors next to each item.
- Spread the list across the page rather than stacking it in one spot.
- Pause and turn the list into a prayer of thanks.
- Revisit the page later and add to it over time.



# Testimony Art

## What

A visual way to tell your story with God. Through drawings, words, symbols, and color, this page reflects how God has worked in your life and what He is still doing.

## Time Required

- 20 to 30 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Testimony focused passages
- Verses about change, growth, or redemption
- Identity focused Scripture

## Materials Needed:

- Paper or journal
- Pens, markers, or colored pencils

## How

- Read a Scripture connected to testimony or transformation.
- Divide the page into sections or areas that represent different parts of your story.

- Before
- During
- After
- Use drawings, symbols, and words to show each part.
- Include moments of struggle, growth, and hope.
- Add Scripture or phrases that connect to each season.
- Use color and space to show movement or change.
- End the page with a prayer or word that reflects where you are now.



# Scripture Coloring Pages

## What

A quiet, focused worship response using coloring pages that are designed around Scripture. This allows time to slow down, reflect, and meditate on God's Word.

## Time Required

- 10 to 20 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Any verse
- Worship and peace focused passages
- Memory verses

## Materials Needed:

- Printed Scripture coloring pages
- Colored pencils, markers, or crayons

## How

- Read the Scripture printed on the page before coloring.
- Choose colors slowly and intentionally.
- Color while rereading the verse silently or aloud.

- Let your pace stay slow and calm.
- Notice which words stand out as you color.
- Pause occasionally to pray or reflect.
- Finish by reading the verse one final time.

# Scripture Typography

## What

A design-focused way to highlight a verse by arranging letters and words visually. Key words can be made larger, bolder, or in a different style to show emphasis and meaning.

- Verses with important themes or repeated words

## Materials Needed:

- Paper or journal
- Pens, markers, or colored pencils

## How

- Choose a verse to highlight.
- Decide which words are most important or meaningful.
- Write the verse in your own creative layout.



# Scripture Mandala

## What

A circular, repeating design using a short verse or phrase. The verse radiates outward in layers, surrounded by shapes, patterns, or symbols that emphasize the Scripture's meaning.

## Time Required

- 15 to 25 minutes

## Scripture Fit

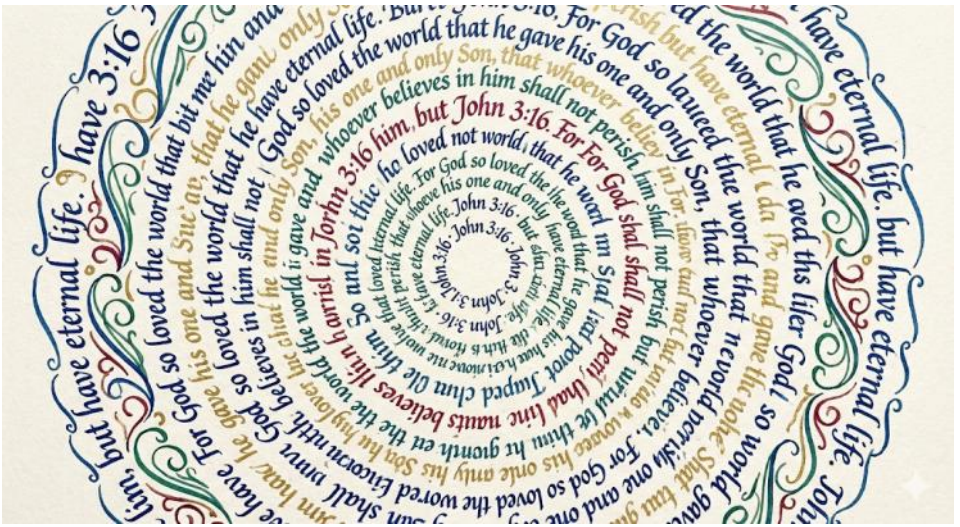
- Short verses or phrases
- Repetitive or rhythmical Scripture

- Verses about life, faith, guidance, or God's protection

## How

- Choose a verse that lends itself to imagery.
- Lightly sketch a simple landscape across your page.
  - Mountains for challenges
  - Rivers for God's provision
  - Paths or roads for life's journey
- Write the verse along the landscape so it weaves through the terrain.
- Add small symbols or details to emphasize specific words or ideas.

# Advertisement for God

## What

A creative project where you design an advertisement that captures God's love and glory.

## Time Required

- 20-30 minutes

## Scripture Fit

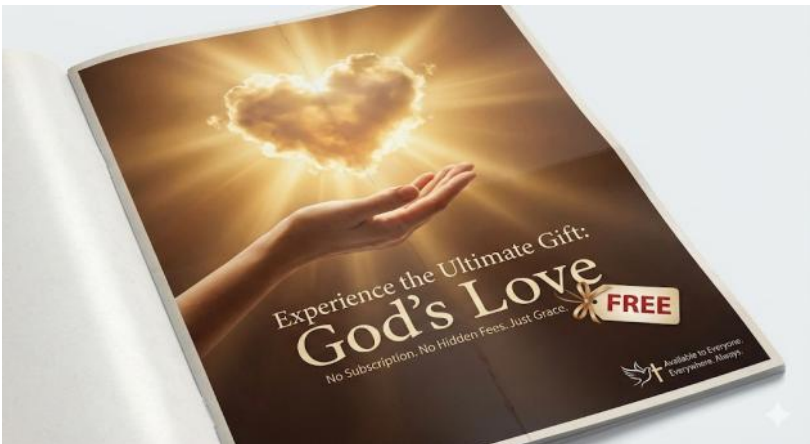

## How

- Start by reading 1 John 4:12 and think about how love reveals God to others. Think about what makes a good advertisement effective.

# Bible Infographics

## What

A creative way to visually represent Scripture by turning passages, themes, characters, or promises into infographics.

## Time Required

- 30-45 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Any passage with patterns, lists, themes, or promises

## Materials Needed:

- Paper, poster board, or sketchbook
- Pens, markers, colored pencils
- Ruler (optional)
- Sticky notes or index cards (optional)
- Bible or Scripture printouts

## How

- Pick a verse, passage, or biblical concept you want to represent visually. For example, a list (like the Beatitudes), a promise (God's faithfulness), or a character study (Jesus' attributes).

- Read the selected Scripture slowly.
- Underline key words, phrases, or ideas that stand out. Ask: *What is the main idea? What's the pattern? What feels most important?*
- Break the Scripture into parts that can be visually represented: Lists become charts or icons. Emotions become symbols. Concepts become shapes (Example (Fruit of the Spirit. Each fruit becomes its own icon or simple picture.)

- Passages about identity, faith, or God's attributes

## Materials Needed:

- Paper or journal
- Pens, markers, or colored pencils
- Pencil to sketch the shape

## How

- Choose a verse or key phrase from the message.
- Pick a simple shape or silhouette that reflects the verse. Heart, cross, tree, sun, or simple object from the passage
- Lightly sketch the shape on your page.
- Begin writing the verse inside the silhouette, shaping the text to fit the outline.
- Adjust letter size or spacing as needed to fill the shape neatly.
- Add small decorations or symbols around or inside the shape for emphasis.
- Reflect on how the combination of words and shape makes the Scripture feel alive and personal.

# Sculptural Worship

## What

A hands-on way to respond to Scripture or a message by shaping clay, playdough, or other moldable materials. This type of worship turns reflection into something tactile, letting your hands help express your heart and thoughts.

## Time Required

- 15 to 25 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Passages about creation, growth, or God's work in life
- Verses with strong imagery
- Psalms and worship-focused Scripture

## Materials Needed:

- Clay, playdough, or modeling materials
- Paper or board to work on
- Optional tools for shaping

## How

- Read the Scripture or listen carefully to the message.
- Think about an image, symbol, or idea from the passage that you want to represent.
- Begin shaping the clay to reflect that concept.
  - A heart for God's love
  - A seed for faith
  - A cross for salvation
- Add details to make the sculpture more personal or symbolic.
- As you work, reflect on what God is saying to you.
- Once finished, display it for a few minutes or leave it on your personal space for continued reflection.

If desired, write the Scripture on a small card to keep with your sculpture.



# Prayer Scarf

## What

A creative worship activity where you crochet or knit a scarf while praying. Each stitch becomes a physical representation of prayer, allowing hands and heart to work together in worship.

## Time Required

- Could take several days

## Scripture Fit

- Verses about persistence in prayer
- Passages about patience, love, or God's faithfulness

## Materials Needed:

- Yarn and crochet hook or knitting needles
- Paper to jot down prayers or Scripture references

## How

- Begin with a short Scripture or theme in mind.
- Hold the intention of prayer as you start your first stitch.
- With each stitch, silently pray for a person, situation, or aspect of your life.
- Continue praying while working along the scarf, letting the rhythm of your hands guide focus.
- Add color changes to represent different prayers, blessings, or themes if desired.
- When finished, read the Scripture or prayer focus again while holding the scarf.
- Use the scarf as a visual reminder of God's faithfulness and your ongoing prayers or gift to the person you were praying for



# Scripture Stones

## What

A tangible way to remember God's faithfulness by writing a word, phrase, or verse on a stone. Collecting these stones creates a visual and physical reminder of Scripture in your life.

## Time Required

- 10 to 20 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Verses about God's faithfulness, promises, or trust
- Short memory verses

## Materials Needed:

- Small smooth stones or rocks
- Permanent markers or paint pens

## How

- Read a verse and choose one word or phrase that stands out.
- Write the word or phrase clearly on the stone.

- Optional: decorate with small symbols or designs that relate to the verse.
- Take a moment to pray or reflect on the verse as you hold the stone.
- Place the stone somewhere visible as a reminder.
- Collect multiple stones over time to create a "faith collection."
- Revisit your stones periodically to reflect on what God has taught you through each verse.



# Puzzle Prayer

## What

A devotional activity where you use puzzle pieces to represent parts of your life or Scripture reflections. Each piece symbolizes a prayer, a challenge, a blessing, or a truth about God.

## Time Required

- 20-40 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Jeremiah 29:11 (God has a plan for you)
- Romans 8:28 (All things together for good)
- Ephesians 2:10 (We are God's workmanship)

## Materials Needed:

- Blank puzzle pieces or pre-cut cardstock pieces
- Pens, markers, or colored pencils
- Bible or Scripture printouts

## How

- Pick a verse or theme as a focus for the puzzle, like God's plan, His promises, or personal growth.
- On each puzzle piece, write a prayer, reflection, or Scripture-related thought. (It can include struggles, blessings, or questions for God.)
- Use colors, symbols, or doodles to represent feelings or ideas visually.
- Try to fit the pieces together on a table or board.
- Reflect on how God can bring seemingly disconnected parts of life into a complete picture.



# Escape Devo

## What

An Escape Room Devotional that turns Scripture and spiritual themes into an interactive challenge.

## Time Required

- 30-60 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Proverbs 2:2-6 (Incline your ear to wisdom)
- Romans 12:2 (Renewing your mind)

## Materials Needed:

- Envelopes or boxes for clues
- Printed puzzles, codes, or scriptures
- Locks with keys or combination puzzles
- Pens, paper, and props (maps, symbols, etc.)

## How

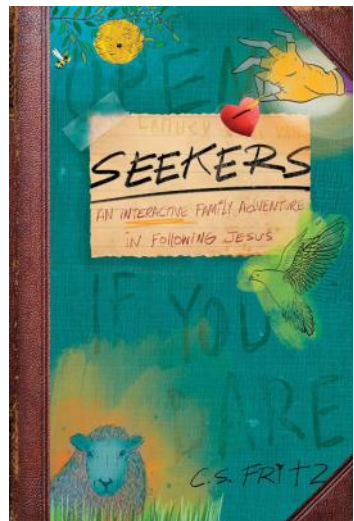
- Select a spiritual theme for the escape room (trust, faith, identity in Christ, God's promises, discipleship). Build the devotional and clues around that theme.
- Determine a sequence of 4-7 puzzle stations participants must complete to "escape." Each station includes a Scripture

prompt and a corresponding challenge.

- At each station, include a Scripture that ties into the puzzle theme. Participants must read and reflect before they can answer or solve.
- Divide into small teams. Give each team the first envelope and a brief overview: *Use Scripture + clues to complete each station and unlock the next.*
- At each station:
  - Read the Scripture aloud.
  - Discuss what the passage means.
  - Complete the challenge.
  - Use the answer to unlock the next station (e.g., the correct code opens a lock, or the key phrase reveals the next clue).
- The last station should reveal a key Scripture that ties the entire devotional together. Display it boldly or have teams write it out from memory.

# Create a Creature

## What

A fun, hands-on activity where you design a brand-new creature, connecting creativity with reflection on God as the Creator.

## Time Required

- 20-30 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Genesis 1:24-25 (God created everything)
- Psalm 104:24 (God's works are wonderful)
- Colossians 1:16 (all things were created)

## Materials Needed:

- Newspapers, tissue paper, or scrap paper
- Cardboard, tape, scissors, and string/wire
- Markers, colored pencils, or paint
- Optional: clay, pipe cleaners, or recycled materials

## How

- Imagine a new creature. Think about what it looks like, how it moves, and what makes it special.

- Make a quick drawing of your creature to plan its design.
- Construct the creature. Be creative with shapes, textures, and colors.
- Give the creature a name and describe its traits, habitat, and purpose.
- Reflect on God's creativity. Ask questions like:
  - *What part of God's creation does your creature remind you of?*

## What

- 1 Samuel 17:45 (David and Goliath)
- Luke 2:7 (Nativity)
- John 15:5 (Abide in Christ)

## Materials Needed:

- Small boxes, shoeboxes, or shallow containers
- Construction paper, cardstock, or foam sheets
- Scissors, glue, tape, or pins
- Small objects, stickers, and markers
- Optional: natural items like leaves or pebbles

## How

- Pick a passage that inspires reflection or is meaningful.
- Plan the Scene
- Use paper cutouts, small objects, and drawings to illustrate the story or message.
- Write the verse inside or outside the box to anchor the scene in God's Word.
- Display for future reflection



# Rainbow Praise

## What

A visual and creative worship activity where you use colors to praise God and reflect on His promises.

## Time Required

- 15-25 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Genesis 9:13-16 (God's promise)
- Revelation 4:3 (God's throne)
- Psalm 150:6 (Praise the Lord)

## Materials Needed:

- Large sheet of paper or poster board
- Colored markers, pencils, or crayons
- Optional: watercolor or paint

## How

- Read Scripture:
- On the large paper, create a seven-color rainbow with distinct arcs.
- Assign a praise or attribute of God to each color (e.g., red for salvation, yellow for

God's provision, green for growth, blue for peace).

- In each color arc, write words, short phrases, or draw symbols that reflect the chosen attribute of God.
- Pause to look at the rainbow and notice how all the colors together show God's goodness in different ways.



# Movement Worship

## What

A creative worship activity where you use your body - gestures, dance, or expressive movement - to worship God or illustrate a Scripture verse.

## Time Required

- 10-25 minutes

## Scripture Fit

- Psalm 149:3 (Praise Him with dance)
- 1 Corinthians 12:4-6 (Use your gifts for God)
- Romans 12:1 (Offer your body as a living sacrifice)

## Materials Needed:

- Open space for movement
- Optional: music player or instruments
- Paper for writing prompts
- Optional: scarves, ribbons, or props

## How

- Select a verse or theme, e.g., Fruits of the Spirit, God's creation, or praise.
- Warm-Up with stretching or gentle movement to prepare physically and mentally.
- Use gestures, dance, or symbolic movements to interpret the verse.
- Use scarves, ribbons, or small items to enhance the visual expression.
- Reflect on how the movements represented the Scripture or personal worship..



# Act It Out

## What

A short skit or frozen scene that visually shows the meaning of a Scripture or message. Instead of explaining the verse with words, the group brings it to life through movement, expressions, and simple actions.

## Time Required

- 10 to 20 minutes

## Scripture Fit

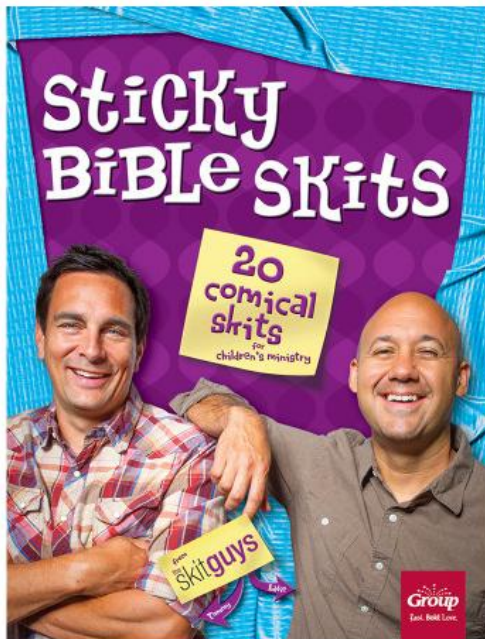
- Bible stories

- Miracles of Jesus

- Psalm 19:1 (the skies proclaim God's handiwork)
- Romans 1:20 (creation reveals God's qualities)

## Materials Needed:

- Natural objects (stones, leaves, flowers, pinecones) or photos of nature
- Paper and pencils or pens

## How

- Read Psalm 8:3-4 aloud and discuss how creation reveals God's glory.
- Get a natural object or image to focus on.
- Spend 3-5 minutes quietly noticing shapes, colors, textures, patterns, and details.
- On paper, write words, phrases, or draw symbols that capture what the object teaches about God.
- Reflect with questions like:

- Use color and creativity freely.
